Over 125 people attend orientation for prospective Habitat homeowners

On Saturday, April 19, 2008, Habitat for Humanity of Merced County hosted an application workshop in partnership with the Housing Authority of the County of Merced, located at 405 U Street, Merced. The workshop was open to all citizens of Merced County.

The purpose of the workshop was to inform prospective homeowners of the Habitat application process and the responsibilities of owning a Habitat house. At the workshop a half hour Power Point presentation was given in English and Spanish. Presently, Habitat is in the process of obtaining building lots located at 512 West 11th Street, 927 West 8th Street and 195 South T Street.

Approximately 125 people attended the workshop. Habitat has received 30 applications as a result of this workshop. The Family Selection committee is now in the process of selecting our next prospective homeowner.

Just over: Jimmy Carter Work Project #25

For the 25th year, former U.S. President Jimmy Carter and his wife, Rosalynn, called attention to both the need for affordable housing and Habitat for Humanity's work to help low-income families realize the goal of home ownership. This year's Jimmy and Rosalynn Carter Project was held along the Gulf Coast, May 11-16 from Houston, TX to Mobile, AL.

In 1984, the Carters led a small team of Habitat volunteers to New York City to help renovate a six-story apartment building with 19 families in need of decent affordable shelter. A quarter of a century later, that modest effort has grown into an internationally-recognized annual event that has taken place in communities around the world.



Our Habitat board was recently enriched by a new member, Jan Sorge. Jan served as hostess for the board's monthly meetings at St. Paul's Lutheran Church from January to June. The July - December board meetings will be in Atwater at the First Church of God, opposite Atwater High.
