Al Zierenberg donated a truck to Habitat, it was sold for \$1500.00. Jan will get a mileage count on our truck. We have until 2021 with about 20,000 per year until an engine is needed to be replaced.

Lyle reported that starting March 1, the ReStore will be open Wednesdays, Fridays and Saturdays 10 a.m to 3 p.m. He is working with the County Human Services Agency to get volunteers who need work experience. The County will pay their wages and we are allowed to train them for up to at least 10 hours a week or more. Jan will do the background checks on these along with all volunteers. Several other volunteers have been working on a weekly basis.

Casey Steed's meeting with Lyle and Jan was postponed as he was ill. It will be rescheduled.

Self=Help Enterprises is partnering with Habitat in Fresno County. Jan called to check on the arrangement. They needed some help in building so sold two lots to Habitat. They operate much differently than we do as Habitat. They plan to build in 11 homes in Winton and 70 in Planada.

The next meeting will spend time discussing all the Merced County Fair details, the shed, cost, etc. raffle ticket price, hand out brochures and give away items.
